### Grama Seva at Bethsaida Home for Aged and Disabled. Conducted on 20<sup>th</sup> October 2013

As part of the "Serve the planet" initiative the Students of Sathya Sai School - Kisaju carried out Grama Seva. A selected group of students and teachers left for the Bethsaida home located at Korrompoi village in Kitengela for Grama Seva on the 20th of October 2013. The Bethsaida Home is a residential home for 85 year old plus and other physically challenged ladies.



25 students and an alumni student accompanied by two teachers visited Bethsaida Home. The area Chief accompanied by a Senior School Trustee also took part in this Seva.

After an introductory talk about beloved Baba's teachings as implemented by Sathya Sai School – Kisaju, the students thanked the elderly ladies for having granted them the opportunity to serve them with food packs and various other items



containing blankets, rice, legumes, salt, oil, sugar, maize meal along with fresh tomatoes, onions, cabbage and kales from the school's Sai farm. The home highly appreciated the kind gesture, love and affection showed to them by the students.

### Visit by Bros. Kishin Khubchandani (Zone Chairman) and Ramesh Hathiramani (Central Coordinator) on 16<sup>th</sup> Nov.

Bro. Kishin Khubchandani (Zonal Chairman) along with Bro. Ramesh Hathiramani (Central Coordinator Region 93), visited our School on 16<sup>th</sup> Nov. Directors, Staff & Students welcome them with a march past. Head Master introduced the teaching fraternity, they then signed the visitors book and were shown a PowerPoint presentation on how values are inculcated in the syllabus. Students had prepared an EHV exhibition on how the "Thought of the Day" is practiced and lived by on the campus including how they maintain their Spiritual Diaries. After a tour of the School's facilities they were taken around the School's Farm, where students showed them practical farming skills they learn. In the Auditorium a lively programme was presented by Students that included poems, value based skits, dances, and practical classroom sessions. After the Head Master and Alumni (Head) addresses, Bro. Kuldip introduced Bro. Kishin and Bro. Ramesh to the students and invited them to address the students.



In his address, Bro. Kishin expressed that after the ground breaking ceremony which he conducted on 24th April 1999, he was visiting the School after 14+ years. Bro. Kishin expressed that he was impressed with the Value Based Education imparted to the students. He went on to bless the teachers to continue with the good work and gave his advise that all teachers should realize their importance. Without a teacher - there can be no judges, no lawyers, no doctors etc. He said that, all teachers should take pride in their teaching profession and should help children to develop a good character. Teachers are strong trees to invest in. A teacher = strong root = strong trunk = Humility - provides fruits selflessly. The happiness of a teacher lies in self satisfaction therefore, one should be contented. The child is born with wisdom, the teacher helps the child to illicit that knowledge.

Bro. Ramesh in his address expressed that it was his first visit and went on to express his satisfaction with the ongoing work carried out at Kisaju. He advised the School's management to continue with the good work and urged everyone to practice values and be an ambassador of Baba's five basic pillars - Love, Peace, Truth, Right Conduct and Non - Violence.
